

Capral Waste Management Report 2025

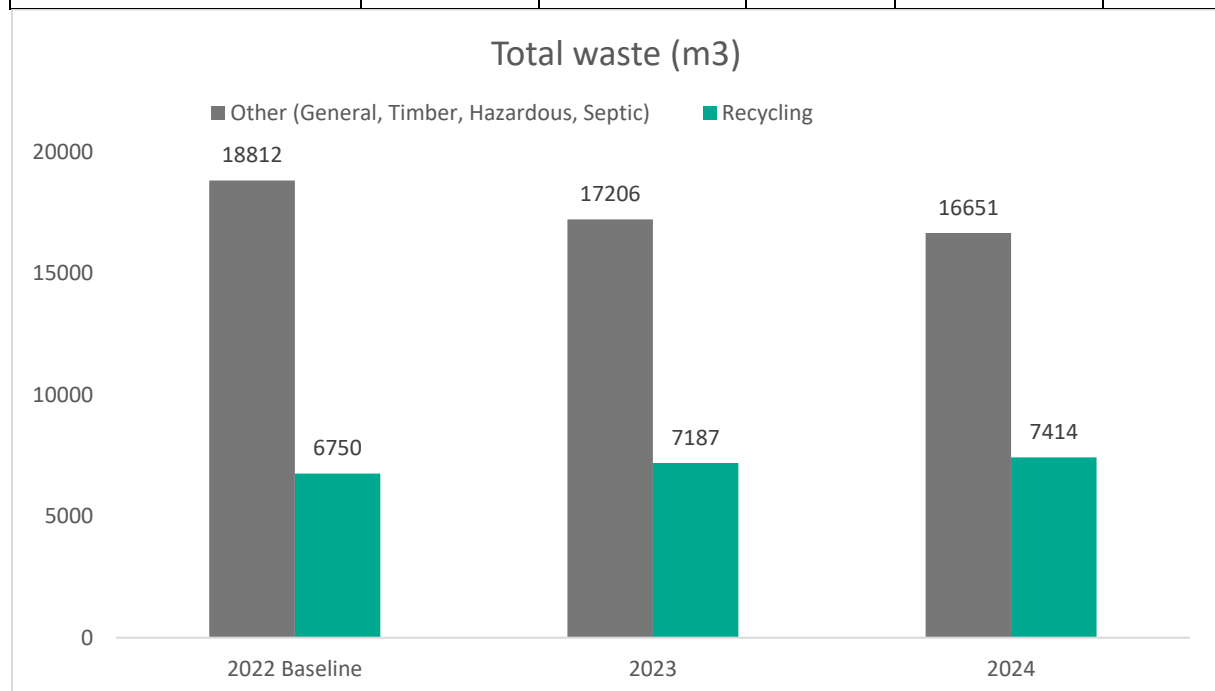
Target

Capral is committed to becoming a zero-waste company, where all waste is minimized, reused, and recycled. Our short-term goal is to achieve a 10% reduction in total annual waste by 2030. Performance will be tracked using baseline data from the 2022 calendar year, starting from the implementation of this strategy.

Progress

Capral has made significant progress in waste reduction, particularly in increasing recycling efforts while decreasing other wastes, including general, timber, hazardous, and septic waste. From the 2022 baseline, recycling waste increased by 6.47% in 2023 and by 9.83% in 2024. Meanwhile, other waste decreased by 8.53% in 2023 and by 11.49% in 2024.

Progress - details

An analysis of waste trends since the 2022 baseline reveals a general decline in most waste categories, with fluctuations in hazardous waste.
